Green Tip of the Week: Green Floor Cleaners. For hard floors, combine 1/4 cup liquid castile (vegetable based) soap with 1/4 to 1/2 cup either vinegar or lemon juice in 2 gallons of warm water in a bucket. Use with a mop or a sponge. For carpet cleaning and disinfecting, blend 1/2 cup baking soda, 1 cup borax, and 1 cup cornmeal. Sprinkle mixture over rug and rub with a cloth. Let rest for several hours or overnight then vacuum up. To remove stains from a carpet, mix 1/4 cup castile soap and 1/3 cup water until well blended. Spread the mixture on the carpet and let sit for a few minutes, then scrub the stain with a brush or a rag. Also- club soda will remove many acidic stains, like coffee, wine, or juice. To deal with big spills, pour cornmeal on the spill, wait 15 minutes for it to be absorbed, then vacuum up.
