Stability and Voice For Families

4th Quarter Offertory

Sharing: The Catalyst Project, a mutually supportive community for up to 3 single moms and their children who have experienced homelessness.

Participants have access to collaborative problem solving, trauma informed mentoring, and therapeutic intervention. The project's founding principle is that the wisdom of those mistreated by our society is essential to creating a society that serves all its people.

Adult Exploration Program

What: Advance Care Planning, Led by Rev. Ralph Tyksinski;

Guest Resource Expert: Dan Zimmerman, Contract Administrator (emeritus/retired) at WI Department of Health Services.

When: Wed, Nov 29, 7:00 pm – 9:00 pm, Prairie Meeting Room

Why: Advance care planning is more than filling out an Advance Directive document. It's about a conversation that helps equip your agent to make decisions for you if you're in a position where you can't speak for yourself.

Discussing whether or when to be resuscitated (CPR); if or when you would want to be ventilated; tube feeding withholding/withdrawal; stating your wishes regarding what persons, music and lighting you would want to be surrounded by when approaching death are conversation topics when completing an Advance Directive.

If you do not have a Power of Attorney for Health Care (Advance Directive) or need to update one this program is for you.

Service description: "Gratitude, Generosity...and Unlearning Colonization" by Rev. Karen Armina

Thanksgiving weekend is complicated. This morning, we'll explore how we might acknowledge the mourning of our indigenous siblings and challenge the myths that have been created and perpetuated by the colonizers of this land, while still practicing the generosity that's come to be associated with this season.

Service: Sunday, Dec 3rd "Humanism: In Command or in Crisis" by Michael Schuler

Dr. Schuler's presentation will be based on his recently published book by the same name. Elements of the discourse will include a description of "doctrinal" humanism as he understands it together with a review of the thought of its most notable proponents. Humanism's contemporary critics include poets, well-known novelists, life scientists and historians, as well as religious figures and public intellectuals. Many of these feel that humanism as an ideology has outlived its usefulness. Which side makes the stronger case?
